Although today's Gospel is short, there is plenty of food for thought. The apostles have returned to Jesus after their mission. They are exhausted and we are told have not even had time to 'eat'. They are in need of rest and nourishment in body, mind and spirit. Jesus gives good instruction to them and to us today: 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while'. Our world demands so much from us, everyone is so busy all of the time. Jesus's instruction tells us that time out is so important; we need to look after ourselves.

Of course it doesn't go to plan. The crowd are desperate for guidance. Jesus takes pity on them as they are like 'sheep without a shepherd'. Either they have no one to guide them or the leaders who are guiding them are offering a fruitless leadership. These people need to be listened to. What are they asking for? What do they need? As Church, are we offering people what they need or are we leading them to the 'safe places' that no longer serve their needs? Where are people going for nourishment today? These are important questions. We must listen to the need in ourselves for rest and nourishment and also respond to the real needs of others.

The Lifting of Restrictions in Church

I can now confirm how we will be celebrating services in our churches after Monday 19th July 2021. This guidance may change going forward, depending upon current events. There will be no signing up on the website for the weekend masses; please just come along. If you have a smart phone 'sign in' at the entrance for track and trace. Hand sanitising upon entry will continue but is not deemed necessary upon exit. Social distancing will not be required in church, unless it is requested. If social distancing is requested, the side aisle benches at All Saints and the front benches at St Lewis will be available. Everyone else will be able to sit wherever you wish and with whom you wish. Standing and kneeling will be re-instated, as will singing. The votive candle stands will also be available for you to light your candles.

The reception of Holy Communion will be restored to its original place— Welcomers will invite people forward and after receiving, Communicants will return to their seats before the final blessing. Churches will continue to be 'ventilated.' (i.e. be drafty!) Welcomers will steward people's exit from church so that overcrowding doesn't occur. The Piety stalls will be available before the start of mass, but NOT afterwards.

BUT: we have been advised by the Diocese that masks will continue to be worn inside church for all services. Lanyards continue to be available for those who are exempt, but you will be expected to sit in the socially distanced area. Not quite freedom day, but what did we expect? A cautious moving forward and hopefully we won't need to take any backward steps come the Autumn. We shall see.

St. Lewis Church: Maintenance of the Grounds.

I am delighted to report that the first part of the tree work has now been completed. Not only have the tree surgeons taken out a number of trees (mainly those that self pollinated or died) but they have lifted the remainder so that most of the lower branches/foilage has been removed. It makes that section of trees facing the entrance to the church look so much better. The second part of the work: all the trees facing the presbytery entrance and between the sections of graves, will have work done on them in late autumn; we simply shouldn't be spending that amount of money all at once and besides, we have done the more urgent work first.
