'You cannot be a prophet in your home country' is a well-known phrase. You don't have to go too far to see examples of this gospel around you. Anyone who returns to their home town with new knowledge and wisdom can sometimes be put in their place. This is what occurs in Jesus' home town of Nazareth in today's gospel. Even though the crowds are impressed by the local carpenter's son, astounded even, and note that he has great wisdom, still he could do no deed of power there. It is definitely a reality check experience. Have you ever had this experience in your own life? A time you were really excited about a new-found knowledge or inspired by a great event or speaker; yet when you returned to tell friends or family members they made fun of you or greeted you with cynicism? Or you can imagine yourself in the crowd today, listening to the local carpenter's son, so full of great teachings you can't quite believe it. In the end Jesus left and went around the villages teaching. Simply put, there are times when you have to move on and bear fruit elsewhere.

'Lord how often you have sent Jesus to us in the form of someone we knew well, but they were just too ordinary for us. All we could see was the carpenter, the son of our neighbour...So the great miracle you had in store for us could not be worked. Lord have mercy.'

Food Bank ~ All Saints

The Foodbank is beginning to run smoothly— as it should and we are now receiving referrals from a number of agencies across the borough. A word of explanation. The Foodbank is run by a referral system— people can receive food by bringing to us a referral form completed by one of the social services agencies in the area supporting people in need including doctors and employment agencies etc...By providing assistance in this way we ensure that those who might fall through the net e.g. because their benefits have yet to come through are supported. The same applies to those who find themselves in particular difficulty; they can access the Foodbank through the support agencies in the area. That's not to say that we would turn anyone anyway who presented themselves for help; rather we would encourage them on any future occasion to obtain a referral letter from one of the above agencies. Please continue to bring your food support to church and do refer to the list below so that we can provide to those in need a balance of appropriate food.

2nd Collection Sea Sunday ~11th July

Every year, churches around the world celebrate Sea Sunday: remembering seafarers in prayer, giving thanks for the crucial work they do. Seafarers are in great need of your prayers this year. During the coronavirus pandemic, they've felt more isolated and have been called upon to make more painful sacrifices than ever before. The UN has called their situation a "humanitarian crisis". In an extreme version of lockdown, at the height of the crisis some 400,000 seafarers were stranded at sea long after their contracts ended, as covid restrictions prevented them from travelling home to their loved ones. Many of these are still waiting to go home.
